#### **President's Report December 2024**

Welcome Delegates and guests to our BDLGA meeting!

The new Qld District Championships was recently held at Royal Pines and was quite a success with **114 players** from **61 clubs** representing 8 female and 11 male Districts. Meg Nunn's daughter, Anne Brown and her husband Bob were also there at the presentation to support the event. The Meg Nunn Salver has been presented back to the Gold Coast to be homed at Southport Golf Club which was Meg's home club.

With 3 days of very close results, the consistency of the Wide Bay teams was tough to beat with the female team scoring 3,100 points. Our BDLGA team came 3rd with 2,800 points. **Kylie Jackson** - Wynnum, **Di Paez** - McLeod, **Amy Kim** - Windaroo, **Nicole Stansfield** - Boonah, **Judy Noble** - Redland Bay and **Joanne Meier** - Carbrook made our District proud. The men's results saw Wide Bay also win with 2,650 points while our BDGA came in a close second on 2,475 points so overall the Wide Bay team took out the championships.

Our players had some fabulous individual and team scores. All players reported they had an amazing time. Surveys have been sent out to players and Districts for feedback regarding the event which will be held annually at Royal Pines Resort in November. Our 2025 team will be selected based on the Gross and Nett winners of the 3 divisions at our **District Championships** which will be held at **McLeod Golf Club** in June 2025.

The Golf Qld AGM was held after the final round of the Royal Pines event and the State said goodbye to **Judy Logan** and **Michelle Stanley** who retired from their positions. We thank them for their representation and we would also like to congratulate **Robyn Byrnes** from the BDLGA who was voted into one of the available Board positions. Unfortunately this means Robyn had to resign her Management Committee role with us but Pennants are in great hands with **Lisa Laney** taking on the Chair role for 2025. Robyn will still be available to assist as a member of our District, for which we thank her.

Our major sponsorship this year from Go Golfing saw the major raffle prize being won by **Judy Noble** from Redland Bay Golf Club. Judy won a luxury golf trip for 2 to the Sunshine Coast in 2025.

#### **Pennants Report December 2024**

#### 2025 Pennant Season

After review of the 2024 season and with no fundamental change to the structure of the competition from 2023, it was decided to alter the divisions on both Friday and Sunday for 2025 by:

- 1. Reducing the maximum GA for Sapphire Divisions to 28, and
- Introducing an Emerald Division with a minimum GA of 20 and a maximum GA of 36 and a minimum aggregate handicap of GA 125. Teams will have five players and all competition will be handicapped.

The concept of running an off the stick (OTS) competition for low handicaps was again considered, but as in previous years there were insufficient clubs that could field teams to make the competition viable. It was decided in the Yellow Diamond divisions, a sub-competition with a Pennant awarded for the team with the most successful group of OTS players will continue as in 2024. We have tried to run the Pennant competition over the past few years in the second term of school.

2025 is an unusual year in that school holidays, Easter, Anzac Day, Labour Day and Mothers' Day combine to make a series of holidays and long weekends. Further it was decided not to run competitions on Mothers' Day in 2025. This has meant the 2025 pennant season has had to start earlier than the past couple of years and be split by an extended break over April and the beginning of May. At the request of the vast majority of Clubs, we have attempted to have the process of determining the draws finalized as early as possible to allow Clubs to lock in dates for hosting competitions.

Thank you to all for lodging their Intention to Compete Forms by September. Draws were sent to Clubs at the end of September and two zones have had date changes since that time. For the 2025 season there will be the following divisions and zones:

- Friday Yellow Diamond has seven teams.
- Friday Sapphire has fifteen teams which have been divided into two zones.
- Friday Emerald has seven teams.
- Sunday Yellow Diamond has six teams.
- Sunday Sapphire has twelve teams which have been divided into two zones.
- Sunday Emerald has six teams.

#### **Golf Genius**

Golf Genius will be used again in 2025 to run the pennant competition. There is an update to the software which was expected to be released in December 2024 but this remains a work in progress. After we receive the update, we will be able to advise whether the processes around the use of Golf Genius can be further simplified. To help ensure all team captains are confident with Golf Genius, it is intended to hold a training session on **Saturday 22 February 2025 at 3 pm to 5pm at RQ Gold Club**. Confirmation will be sent to Clubs closer to the event.

#### **Pennant Regulations**

It is intended Pennant Regulations will remain fundamentally the same as in 2024 with the

alterations necessary for the changes to Sapphire Division handicap limits and the introduction of Emerald Division. There may be changes arising from any other Golf Genius changes. The Regulations for the year will be posted as soon as possible.

2024 was my third season as Pennant Co-ordinator and I have enjoyed meeting so many of the BDLGA members. Thank you for all your assistance over the past three years and your understanding and help when things changed or did not go ahead as expected. Thanks also for embracing the move to Golf Genius.

I have taken on a role with Golf Queensland Limited, therefore I have had to resign as a member of the BDLGA Management Committee and as the Chair of the Pennant Sub-committee.

I thank everyone who was so helpful during the year, in particular the other Pennant Subcommittee members **Jacque Giles** and especially our President, **Renai Ridley** who had to take over running the competition while I was away. A special thank you also to **Lisa Laney** who joined the Management Committee this year coming onto the Pennant Sub-committee and will be taking over the role as the Pennant Chair going forward.
